Around half of all 11 to 16 year-olds in the EU had encountered one or more of ten frequent internet risks.⁽²⁾

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20.4 billion connected things would be in use worldwide by 2020, compared to 8.4 billion at the end of 2017.



Yet **51%** of European citizens feel not at all or not well informed about cyber threats.⁽³⁾

1. Safer Internet Centres

- INSAFE Helplines
- INHOPE Hotlines

11MIO EUR/year

- #SaferInternet4EU campaign
- Safer Internet Day (140 countries)



#SaferInternet4EU

1. The #SaferInternet4EU Competition to reward high quality resources and inspiring initiatives on safer and better internet from organisations, teachers and youth. Over 600 entries were submitted, and more than 7000 people voted for their favourites! Check the winners on www.betterinternetforkids.eu

2. Two EU-wide online learning events for teachers:

MOOC with resources and activities on fake news, cyberbullying and radicalisation with participants from more than 65 countries

Online learning event on cyber-hygiene during Cyber Security month in 22 Member States

3. A network of **Ambassadors** promoting the #SaferInternet4EU campaign including MEPs, industry representatives, young people and experts on online safety and cyber-security.





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2. Dialogue & Cooperation

- MS Expert Group
- Alliance to Better Protect Minors Online
 - wide range of stakeholders
 - statement of purpose + individual committments
 - COM presence as clear strenght



3. Regulatory measures

- UNCRC + Charter: legal basis
- Child Sexual Abuse Directive
- Audiovisual Media Services Directive
- General Data Protection Regulation
- Soft law measures: countering illegal online hatespeech





Child Sexual Abuse Directive

- prompt removal of web pages containing CSA images
- block access
- awareness raising and prevention
- practical challenges in implementation, and disparities between MS



Audiovisual Media Services Directive

- 2018 update: reflect changes in audiovisual market (online)
- protection from harmful content
- new obligations for video-sharing platforms: age verification; parental control systems; content rating



General Data Protection Regulation

- designed to harmonise data privacy laws; directly applicable (25 May 2018)
- additional layer of protection for processing data of vulnerable persons
- Art 8 consent vs parental authoritsation
- Art 12 information & communication
